A historic restaurant building in the East Valley has been sold and will be preserved.

The Landmark Restaurant on Main Street in downtown Mesa was sold in a \$1 million deal.

Aldea Weddings, a Peoria-based event planner, bought the building from Don and Candy Ellis.

The Landmark Restaurant property was built in 1925. It has been a restaurant, a building used by the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints and was actually where Mesa Community College began in 1963.

The city of Mesa worked with the seller and buyer to make sure the building was preserved. Aldea will use the property for wedding receptions and banquets.

Commercial Properties Inc. brokers [Rex Griswold](#) and [Andrew Jaffe](#) represented the seller. Avocat Group-Arizona represented the buyers.
